
# AZED No. 1,834 'Overlaps'

#### Postcode

Down clues are normal. Each across clue leads to two words which overlap, the last two letters of the first being the first two (in the same order) of the second. The overlaps occupy the central section of the diagram, bordered left and right by broken bars. Each across clue consists of clues to the two overlapping words, in either order; one of these is normal, but in the other the cryptic indication refers only to the full word minus the overlapping portion. Either of the two overlapping words may be clued first and the types of clue that make up each double clue may be in either order.
