
# AZED No. 2,318 'Please to remember...' Competition Puzzle

Eighteen clues are thematic. Each consists of a definition of a word and a subsidiary indication of that word treated thematically to provide the grid entry, always a non-word. **1Across**, clued by definition only, illustrates the theme explicitly. All other clues are normal. Numbers in brackets indicate the length of grid entries throughout. Competitors should submit with their entries a clue to **1Across** in the style of the other thematic clues.
