The letter entered may be up to six letters away from the non-matching letters in each
case, e.g. X might represent W/Y, V/Z, U/A, T/B, S/C, or R/D. case, e.g. X might represent $W / Y, V / Z, U / A, T / B, S / C$, or R/D. The eleven letters thus entered, read row by row from top to bottom of the diagram, form the surname of a famous female. Competitors should submilt with their entrles a normal cryptic clue to thls name. No across or down word is affected more than once, and the replaced letters may occur in either order
